The South Carolina legislature has completed its 1999 regular session. No legislation having an adverse impact on RJR or the tobacco industry was enacted. A bill to eliminate the sale of gray market cigarettes was passed.

Legislation Enacted

HB3789	Enacts the MSA renegade model legislation
HB3826	Prohibits sale of gray market cigarettes
SB739 fund	Establishes mechanism to allow growers to participate in the trust

HB3132	Increases penalties for minors possession of tobacco products
HB3262	Establishes trust fund for MSA payments
HB3828	Use MSA payments to fund community development with emphasis on rural areas

- HB3921 Ban smoking in State House and legislative buildings
- SB309 Use MSA payments to create Family Farm Fund
- SB656 Urges President and Congress to allow states to retain MSA funds

Session Summary

The industry team in South Carolina is well coordinated and very effective. Of special note was the team's ability to pass the gray market legislation. Fred continues to do a good

job in representing RJR, especially with the leadership of the House.
