






Comments:

**Colorado:** Effective March 15, 2000, contributions to candidate committees are permitted per election cycle, in the amounts of \$5,000-Governor, \$2,500-Lt. Governor, Secretary of State, State Treasurer, Attorney General; \$1,500 State Senate, District Attorney; \$1,000-House of Representatives, Board of Education, University Regent. Contributions to political parties and political committees are limited to \$25,000 in the aggregate per year. No reporting.

**Florida:** Maximum amount \$500 per election per candidate for statewide office or retention of a Supreme Court Justice, Judge of District Court of Appeals and to a candidate for countywide office or to a candidate in any election conducted on less than a countywide basis, for legislative or multi-county office, for county court judge or circuit judge or to a

political committee supporting or opposing one or more candidates. No limits for political parties. Periodic reporting.

**Maine:** Effective 1/9/99, maximum amount \$500/election for any gubernatorial candidate and \$250/election for any other candidates. Per Ethics Commission - Law does not address limitations to committees. No reporting.

**Maryland:** Maximum amount \$4,000/candidate/four-year election cycle. Total contributions cannot exceed \$10,000 in any four-year election cycle. Periodic reporting.

**Maryland:** FROM RJR PAC. Maximum amount \$4,000/candidate/four-yr. election cycle. Total contributions cannot exceed \$10,000 in any four-year election cycle. FEC report.

**Michigan:** FROM MICHIGAN STATE PAC (registered as an independent committee). Maximum amount per election cycle \$34,000 for state-elected candidates, \$10,000 for state senator, and \$5,000 for state representative. No maximum amount for political parties. Tri-annual reporting required.

**Missouri:** The Supreme Court has reinstated campaign contribution limits: maximum amount of \$300 per election cycle for House of Representatives candidates and \$575 per election cycle for Senate candidates. Maximum amount for statewide candidates is \$1,175 per election cycle. There are no limits for contributions to continuing committees. No reporting.

**Montana:** FROM RJR PAC. Maximum amount \$400/candidate/election for governor/lt. governor (jointly), \$200 other statewide offices, \$100 all other public offices. No maximum amount for political parties. Periodic reporting.

**South Carolina:** Maximum amount per election is \$3,500 for any statewide office candidate or \$1,000 for any other candidate. Contributions to party committee's party building accounts have no limits; contributions to party committee's state accounts are limited to \$3,500 in a calendar year. Maximum amount to a PAC is \$3,500 in a calendar year. Report on lobbyist principal report.

**South Dakota:** FROM RJR PAC. No maximum amount. FEC report.

**Tennessee:** FROM RJR PAC. Maximum amount for statewide office \$7,500 per election, for state senate \$7,500 per election, for other state offices and all local elected offices \$5,000 per election. No limits to political parties. Periodic reporting.

**Virginia:** No maximum amount. No reporting.

**Washington:** Effective ~~March 1~~<sup>2</sup>, 2000, maximum amount is \$625 per election for candidates running for state house and senate and up to \$1,200 per election for ~~all other~~ candidates for state office. Maximum amount for state parties is \$3,000 per calendar year. Contributions to state parties' exempt accounts have no limits. (Maximum amount will be adjusted every two years to allow for inflation.) No report if contributions are made with

general corporate funds, unless corporation gives more than \$12,000 in aggregate to state office candidates.

**West Virginia:** FROM RJR PAC. Maximum amount \$1,000 per candidate or committee per election. Periodic reporting.

~~**New Republican Majority Fund (non-federal):** Committee is a permanent, independent political committee whose work is at the state level and, therefore, the committee is able to accept corporate funds.~~
